**President's Comments:** President Bud Glass welcomed Craig Farthing to the Board and thanked him for stepping up. He also congratulated Josh Waltz, the new Jefco Aeromod'lers Vice President and thanked him for taking the position. Bud also expressed his congratulations to Lora & all Warbirds & Classics Over Denver volunteers. He noted it was a very good event in spite of less than ideal weather.

## **Old/Unfinished Business:**

## Fun Fly Report – May & June 2019

This is the first report on the new series of fun fly events. We first met on Thursday, May 30<sup>th</sup> – the sun greeted us along with very mild winds of less than five mph and temperatures in the 60s. A nice change from the snowy, cold and wet weather earlier that month. Flying conditions were perfect!

Fifteen club members attended the Washer Drop event in May. We had a good time and many laughs, but also a couple aircraft accidents. A number of different types of models were represented – a few sticks, high-wing tricycle gear, and acrobatic. The best score on a single attempt (lowest distance from the marker) was 7' 1" achieved by Loren O'Dell. Adjusting for his successful spot landing lowered this to -2' 11" (yes, that's a negative result!!)

The top three positions were awarded with winners ribbons, and as a special bonus for this kickoff event Bud Glass donated gift certificates to Action Hobbies. First place received a \$20.00 award, second place \$15.00 and third place \$10.00.

In June we met on the 19<sup>th</sup> and again the sun, along with temperatures up to 80, welcomed us, and winds were generally around 5mph but frequently changed direction. And I was able to put aside the plans I had drawn up for the ark during the recent thunderstorms and return to flying.

The June event was the Fast 'n Slow. Twelve pilots flew the event and more than fifteen attended. Each pilot had three opportunities to fly fast and then slow. We averaged their times and subtracted the fast speed from the average slow speed. We also had bonuses for those who achieved a spot landing - 0.5 seconds or 0.25 seconds was added to the net speed depending on where the spot landing took place.

The top three positions were awarded with IOUs for the winners ribbons (as we haven't received the club award ribbons).

## Fun-Fly #3 – "Jefco Aeromod'lers 500" Thursday, July 18, 2019 10:00 AM

We're bringing the thrill of the Indy 500 to Chatfield!! And you'll get to do much more than drive around an oval track....

The single purpose of this special meeting was for the Board of Directors to conduct a confirmation vote installing Board Member Josh Waltz as Vice President of Jefco Aeromod'lers.

Larry Fagan made a motion to nominate Josh Waltz to be confirmed as Vice President of the Jefco Aeromod'lers RC Club through the end of the current term, effective immediately. The motion was seconded by Lora Knowlton and the motion carried.

**Motion to Adjourn:** A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Larry Fagan and was seconded by Josh Waltz. The meeting was adjourned at 8:59 P.M.

- Field Maintenance and Runways: Bud reports the field is ready for the Warbirds & Classics Over Denver event. Bud thanked the volunteers that helped with the field clean-up again.
- **FPV:** Bud said he will set up the signs and install rules in the kiosk for FPV drone racing after the Warbirds & Classics Over Denver event. A fixed wing FPV rules committee needs to be set up after FPV drone racing is underway.
- Flight Instruction / Training: Bud reports he had more new inquiries about flight training. Bud informed those inquiring that student training would continue after the Warbirds & Classics Over Denver event.
- **Safety Officer's Report:** Bud and Ron showed pictures of the battery disposal barrel they built from a discarded Park pop can recycle barrel. The barrel contains a saltwater container with a retrieval basket to catch the discarded batteries and allow them to be chemically neutralized so they can safely be disposed of in the trash container. Patrick O'Grady built the battery drop mechanism on top resembling a postal mail box so that people cannot get their hand inside to fish around in the retrieval basket.
- Shea Homes / Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC): Bud gave the LRPC report for Bruce Ream who did not attend. The LRPC reviewed the 90% completed drawings and specifications for the new runway. There are a few minor details that need to be finalized by the engineer. Following a final review by the LRPC, the final plans will be presented to the Park, the Corps of Engineers and Shea Homes for their approval. Then the project goes out to bid.

## **Member Showcase – Frank Fussenegger**



I grew up in Topeka Kansas, where m y fascination with model airplanes began. The local park had a control line circle where we could watch the big boys play model with airplanes. I could afford not anything more than a few plastic models with Cox . 049 Babe Bee glow engines, all

of which never lasted more than one lap around the circle. I had a little more luck with glow engine cars like a Cox Prop Rod, but could never get it off the ground.

After high school, I joined the Marine Air Wing and went to school to be an electronic technician. While training at the Memphis Naval Air Station, I spent my weekends building control line models at the base hobby shop. This is where I finally learned to fly a model airplane successfully, even though it was only in circles. While in the Marines I also played with F8 Crusaders as a fire control technician. However, military life was not for me, so I moved back to Kansas in 1968.

Not having a clue about what I wanted to do with my life, I enrolled at Washburn University in Topeka to try and figure it out. I eventually moved to Boulder Colorado for graduate school in Mathematics, and married my wife Pam in 1974.

After school I started to work as a computer programmer at Martin Marietta, now named Lockheed Martin, close to our Chatfield State Park. With a job, I could finally afford to build an RC model, a Sig Kadet.

This is when I first joined Jefco Aeromod'lers around 1978, and thanks to the club instruction program I learned to fly a RC model airplane.

For a while I was quite active in our club. I spent one term on the board and was the club's Flight Instruction Chairman from 1983 to 1986. The 1980s was a good period for the club. This was before 1/4 scale was as a thing, and if you had an Ugly Stick with a piped 60 Rossi, you were hot stuff. I built mostly 40 sized models, like the Sig Kadet, Sig Caviler, Super Sportster 40, Scat Cat 500 pylon racers. You had to build your own models back then. There were no ARFs or foamies that you flew right after you took them out of the box.

After the birth of the second of our two children (Angela and Jason), family responsibilities took over and I was out of the hobby for about 10 years. I eventually tried to interest my son in model airplanes, which did not take, and I dabbled a little off and on in the hobby up until I retired in 2012.

In 2007 I started to get serious again about the hobby and built a couple larger aerobatic planes, an Extreme Flight 74" Yak with a YS 170 and an Aeroworks 78" Extra 260 with a DA 50. I enjoyed flying these models for a number of years until I moved to the Dark Side of the hobby and started to play with model helicopters around 2014.

Model helicopters has been my main interest lately. My two favorite models are both 700 sized Synergy helicopters, e.g. they have 700mm main blades for a main rotor diameter of about 5 ft. One is gasoline powered and one electric.

Unfortunately, I started playing with helicopters when most of the helicopter pilots at our field move on or switched to flying fixed wing models, or planks as the helicopter crowd calls them. I like to say, "If you don't have enough trouble in your life, you should try a model helicopter." If you are crazy enough to want to try a model helicopter, then come talk to me.

The Jefco Aeromod'lers will celebrate National Model Aviation Day, Saturday, August 17 in conjunction with the club's Annual Pylon Race.
