BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND! SILENT AUCTION - 8AM - 10AM - in an effort for all items to be available to more customers, all items are available in the Silent Auction from 8am - 10am. As required, all items will be labeled with a "STARTING BID/BUY-IT-NOW" price. Buyers can bid on one or more items (no limit!) with handwritten bids. At 10am, the silent auction will close and the winning written bid is secured for each individual item. After the Silent Auction closes, all remaining items may still be purchased at the "STARTING BID/BUY-IT-NOW" price through the auction. There is no limit to the number of items that can be purchased at any one time at the "BUY-IT-NOW" price after the Silent Auction.

BASIC INFORMATION FOR SELLERS:

- When you arrive at the auction, leave your items in your vehicle come inside and check in first.
- A \$15 Buyer/Seller registration fee will be charged on-site at check-in if you did not pre-register before January 17.
- \$5 or 15% to the Jefco Aeromod'lers Club #176 will be retained for each item sold (whichever is greater).
- All items and/or money owed must be collected/paid for by 3pm on Saturday, January 25.
- Items not collected or paid for by 3pm on Saturday will be deemed a DONATION to the Jefco Aeromod'lers Club.
- Payments to sellers will be made via club check NO CASH will be paid out.
- NO CHECKS WILL BE MAILED. You must be present at the auction to receive your check payment.
- All items must have a realistic value of at least \$25. Several items of lesser value may be grouped together for a combined value of \$25.
- Acceptable items include RC hobby-related items such as airplanes, jets, cars, helicopters, gliders, radios, engines, FPV items, tools, aviation-related items. No magazines, fuel or junk! All glow/gas powered models must have all fuel removed from tank and fuel lines. We reserve the right to reject items for sale that do not meet auction standards. Small or grouped items should be in clear plastic bags and stapled shut when practical.
- Two Prices are required for each item:
 - 1. **MINIMUM PRICE** all items for sale **MUST** list a MINIMUM price, no lower than \$25. The MINIMUM should be set to the lowest price that the Seller is willing to accept during the auction event. When the item goes up on stage for auction, no item will be sold for less than the minimum specified without the seller's approval. If there are no offers of, at least, the specified minimum bid the item will be sent to a PASS Table.
 - 2. **STARTING BID/BUY-IT-NOW** all items for sale must list a Starting Bid/Buy-It-Now price, allowing all items for sale to be eligible in the silent auction or purchased before going to the auction block. The STARTING BID/BUY-IT-NOW price is set above the minimum and is set at a level that the Seller feels the item will sell at: 1) as a starting bid at the silent auction or 2) prior to the live auction. This allows those buyers the opportunity to acquire an item that the seller feels is a fair price. STARTING BID/BUY-IT-NOW prices may not be added or changed after an item has been checked in. December 4, 2019 Jefco Aeromod'lers R/C Club Business Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by President Bud Glass at 7:02 PM at the Alice Terry Elementary School. There were 25 in attendance.

<u>NEW GUESTS and NEW MEMBERS</u>: President Glass thanked everyone for attending. He announced new members Jorge Castorena of Denver and Charles Brock of Littleton. Neither was in attendance.

<u>President's Comments</u> / <u>Announcements</u>: Bud announced the passing of Vietnam veteran and longtime member Bruce Robson. He called for a moment of silence in Bruce's memory, as well as those who died in the December 7th attack on Pearl Harbor.

Bud thanked Tom Higgins & Lee Taylor, Tom Boyce & Kimberly Miller for bringing coffee & refreshments.

Bud also thanked Ron Ratcliffe for serving on the BOD and as Safety Officer the past year. His time and dedication to the job is very much appreciated.

Bud announced that Scott Roush, Chatfield Park Manager, has been promoted to Deputy Region Manager for the North East Region. Chris Wahlers, Operations Manager, will become the acting Park Manager until a permanent replacement is named.

Bud thanked Johny Wolf for volunteering to be the new Drawing Coordinator.

<u>Club History Project</u> – Bud spoke with Tom Elliot who said the project is well underway and Terry Barnhart is doing a yeomen's job putting things together. Bud said there will be an opportunity to place your reservation for a copy of the hardbound coffee table edition soon. He expects the announcement to be made in the first part of the new year.

<u>Program</u>: Jeff Gittelman presented the iPhone app, <u>RC Logbook</u> by clevertangerine software. It is available at the Apple® App Store. This app is basically a journal where you can keep track of your RC activities. You can track your aircraft on a flight by flight basis, and track your battery use and charging cycles. A picture can be assigned to each aircraft for ease of identification of a particular aircraft so its history can be easily accessed.

Jeff has been in contact with the developer who is very service-oriented. He was very responsive and most helpful. Another member at the meeting said he has been using RC Flight and Battery Log by Stephen Impey Software (iPhone or Android) and finds it more flexible than RC Logbook. [Ed. note: Subsequent to the meeting Jeff researched this alternative and has himself now switched over too, as it is more flexible and easier to use.]

Jeff mentioned there are no fun-flys scheduled yet, but he would like to hold a snow fun-fly. It will be weather contingent, so will likely occur on short notice.

Old/Unfinished Business:

- Final FPV Fixed-Wing & Free Style rules Bud hand-delivered the proposed final FPV Fixed-Wing & Free Style Rules to park officials for approval on September 03. He has received no reply from the park as yet.
- Columbine High School Student Model Aviation Program (Pending) – Bud is considering approaching the school to see if we can perform and indoor flight demonstration during one of their assemblies.
- Valor Christian High School Avionics STEM Program Update – Bud reported he and Rick Russon had discussed doing some demo flights at their outdoor athletic complex the previous week, but they were snowed out. The demo flights are on hold once again.

New Business:

- BOD Action Bud announced that the BOD approved reducing At-Large Board Positions from 4 to 2. Lora Knowlton will hold the combined position of Secretary/ Treasurer on an interim basis, while Larry Fagan will fill one At-Large position as Newsletter Editor, AV Coordinator, and Program Chair. These changes take effect January 01, 2020.
- Club Jackets Bud asked the members if there would be any interest in purchasing club jackets with an embroidered club logo. Bud showed slides of the front and back of jackets with the Denver RC Eagles logo as an example of what they might look like. Bud asked for a show of hands and twelve to fifteen members expressed an interest in ordering a jacket. Bud will look into pricing details and report back.
- 2020 Budget Lora Knowlton presented the 2020 Budget as recommended by the BOD. The draft budget that the board was originally considering included several new "wish list" items, such as a carport roof for the storage yard, runway striping, an asphalt crack fill machine and small tools budget. This draft budget initially exceeded the projected income by a significant amount. The BOD then spent a considerable amount of time adjusting the budget down to more in line with the projected income. The resulting outcome was the board recommended budget that was presented at this meeting. Lora explained each budget class, explained items that were new or different from the previous years approved budget and answered questions. Jeff Gittelman made a motion to accept the 2020 budget as presented which was seconded by Ron Ratcliffe. The motion passed unanimously. Bud wanted to recognize Lora for the great effort she has expended in generating the budget and thanked her publicly. The membership acknowledged Lora's work with a strong round of applause.

December 4, 2019 Jefco Aeromod'lers R/C Club Business Meeting Minutes (Cont)

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Larry Fagan asked for a motion to approve the November 6, 2019 general meeting minutes published in the December newsletter. A motion was made by Lee Taylor to accept the secretary's report. It was seconded by Jeff Gittelman and carried.

<u>Safety Officer's Report</u> – Ron Ratcliffe reported emptying the lipo disposal barrel again. He also said from a safety standpoint, if you see something, say something. Most people are happy to comply once a safety rule has been pointed out.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Lora Knowlton had no report as the focus for the meeting was the 2020 budget presentation.

Committee Reports:

- Membership Report Lora reported that membership invoices are available this evening for those in attendance. Invoices will be mailed to those not in attendance. Included with the invoice is a Membership Information Verification form. Please review the info we have on file for you, as this helps to keep you in contact with the club. Memberships can be reviewed via the invoice and verification form with check/cash payment or via the online form on the website with a credit card.
- Auction Committee: Craig Farthing asked for volunteers to deliver auction flyers to hobby shops. Several members stepped forward. He said the auction committee is still looking for volunteers to assist at the event. He mentioned that Terry Hock has created an online sign-up form on the website. Craig says a concerted effort to contact all clubs within a 50 mile radius is being made.
- Field Maintenance and Runways: Bud asked members to please sign-up for the snow removal call list if they are willing to help (snow removal from the field areas and runways). Bud mentioned that the recent big snow was wet and heavy and the machinery was not able to handle it. He thanked Tom Elliot for clearing off the runway several days later, as it was much easier after the weather warmed up.
- Flight Instruction / Training: Bud reports he has one new student, Charles Brock.
- Shea Homes / Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC): There were no updates.

Show and Tell: Member Tom Higgins brought some very fine folding model stands and model balance stands that he designed and built in his wood shop. The stands have been made so that they can be personalized with your name. Be on the lookout for some of these stands to be given away as door prizes at future meetings. Craig Farthing then showed a much smaller version that Tom made for him for use with his pylon racers. This version folds up into a very small package for easy transportation that could be stored in a hobby box.

Hank Diepenbroek showed a Graupner MZ-16 programmable radio that he won at one of the pylon racing events he attended. It has a touch screen that is fully customizable and alerts can be voiced in one of five languages. Hank anticipates it will take him quite some time to acquaint himself with all its features. Next, he showed a rechargeable glow driver that has a glow plug testing feature built in. The unit is produced by Radio South RC. Hank brought some skis he fabricated using several layers of carbon fiber. He used model car shocks to stabilize the skis while maneuvering on snow. The ski size is determined in part by the weight of the plane. Tom Elliot pointed out that the relationship of size and weight is not linear. Terry Hock added that Tom's spreadsheet for ski size design is available under the resources tab on the club's website.

<u>Drawing</u>: Johny Wolf has stepped forward to coordinate the drawing at club meetings. Tonight's drawing prize was a Protech RC "Prodigy 66 Duo AC/DC" Dual Voltage 50 Watt Fully Automatic AC/DC Powered Charger supplied by HobbyTown USA located at Mineral and Broadway in Littleton. Craig Farthing won the drawing. Door Prizes: Tom Elliot won the "Unbreakable" aluminum flashlight and Patrick O'Grady won the LED illuminated tire gauge.

MOTION to ADJOURN: Lora Knowlton made a motion to adjourn and it was seconded by Dave Hock. The meeting adjourned at 8:33pm.

President's Comments: President Bud Glass thanked BOD members for their support to the club by volunteering to serve on the BOD.

Old/Unfinished Business:

 Club History Committee Project Update – Bud stated that the coffee table book reservations are starting to trickle in. Reservation notices about the books were included with membership invoices that were mailed.

Old/Unfinished Business:

- Valor Christian High School STEM Program Model Aviation Pilot Program. The weather has been a factor in not being able to set up a demonstration flight at the school's athletic field.
- Columbine High School Model Aviation Program

 Bud sent a suggestion to have an introduction and flight demo in the gym to Assistant Principal Cory Olsen and is waiting on a reply.

New Business:

- · Newsletter (Electronic Version Only) There have been some ongoing discussions about the cost of producing the hard copy version of the club newsletter to a very small number of recipients (hobby shops, park, members who do not have access to a computer, etc). At the present time the club is paying in excess of \$1000.00 a year to provide these printed newsletters. After printing, there is also time involved for the newsletters to be picked up from the printer, then labeled, stamped and put in the mail. There are also often issues with 'late breaking news' that can't be put into the newsletter due to printer deadlines, etc. Generally speaking, the Board recommended that the hard copy process be discontinued for efficiencies and as a cost savings measure. It was suggested that those who do not have access to a computer could ask a relative, neighbor or friend to provide the club with their email address, so the newsletter can be sent to them, and they can print it out for the member or recipient. Craig Farthing made a motion to eliminate printing and mailing hardcopies of the monthly newsletter effective with the February 2020 newsletter. Hank Diepenbroek seconded the motion and after considerable discussion the motion passed.
- Newsletter (Advertising Opportunities) The pros/ cons of allowing advertising in the monthly club newsletter were discussed at length. Previous board of directors were not in favor for a host of reasons as

Lora explained. Overall, the current board agreed that allowing advertising would generate some new revenue options. Policies and specs regarding advertising would need to be determined. Hank Diepenbroek motioned to allow advertising in the monthly club newsletter. Ron Ratcliffe seconded the motion. During the motion discussion, it was decided that policies and specs for ads would be determined in the near future. The motion passed. The board will email Lora any suggested policies and specs, of which she will compile and prepare a formal Newsletter Advertising Policies & Specifications. An announcement about allowing advertising will be made at the January 2020 meeting.

- Banner & Flyers for Hobby Town Littleton Bud has successfully completed a lengthy negotiation with Hobby Town Littleton to the mutual benefit of both parties as follows: HobbyTown Littleton has agreed to provide airplanes, chargers and other items for our monthly drawing at no charge, to allow Jefco Aeromod'lers to hang a large club banner in their store and they will paste a label on every RC airplane sold, advertising Jefco Aeromod'lers RC Club, with emphasis on our "Learn to Fly" program. In exchange, Jefco Aeromod'lers will provide a monthly page in our newsletter at no charge for HobbyTown Littleton advertising, and we will display a HobbyTown Littleton sponsor banner at all major club events. The BOD was unanimously in favor of the idea. A short discussion followed regarding the Club information and details that would be included on the banner and the labels.
- Club Jackets Bud stated that the minimum order for jackets was 30 from the supplier he contacted. Since 12 to 15 members expressed interest at the December 4 general meeting he anticipates there should be no problem in meeting the minimum order requirements. Lora suggested getting in touch with the previous supplier who might still have the embroidery file on hand. That may save us a setup charge for the embroidery file. Lora suggested pricing having individual names and AMA numbers on the jackets as well. Bud will be looking into these options.
- Magnificent Mountain Men Free Flight Club (MMM) Flyer – The MMM have a flyer they would like to post in our newsletter for indoor flying during the winter months. They have agreed to promote our upcoming 2020 auction to their membership and the BOD felt it was a fair exchange. Larry will put the flyer in the January newsletter.

December 18, 2019 Jefco Aeromod'lers R/C Club Board Meeting Minutes (Cont)

Secretary's Report: Larry Fagan requested a motion for approval of the November 20 Board meeting minutes as published in the December newsletter. Josh Waltz made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Ron Ratcliffe and the motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Lora distributed the monthly financials for BOD review. She stated the rent for the monthly club meeting school facility is still outstanding. Larry Fagan made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report which was seconded by Josh Waltz. The motion carried.

Safety: Ron had no report, but handed over paperwork to incoming Safety Officer Craig Farthing. Ron will continue to maintain the battery disposal barrel.

Committee Reports:

Craig and fellow Co-Chair Josh Waltz discussed work flow, and capitalizing on people's expertise. Craig reports that the Pikes Peak Soaring Society will discuss the auction at their club meeting tonight, as will the Denver RC Eagles and the Arvada Associated Modelers at their next meetings.

Additional names for the volunteer list were discussed, and Craig and Josh will contact them.

- Membership Report: Lora reported that membership renewals are pouring in. They will be posted as deferred income to next year.
- Field Maintenance & Runways Bud Glass has set up a Snow Removal Volunteer List. Patrick O'Grady and Rick Gonzales have signed up. Ron Ratcliffe volunteered to be added to the list.
- FPV Rule Committee Craig Farthing: (Still waiting on rule approval by the Park).
- Flight Instruction / Training Bud Glass reported Abram Groves has signed up but not started yet due to the inclement weather.
- Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC) Bud reported that the LRPC is working with a number of paving contractors in an effort to secure interest in bidding the project in the spring, and to solicit contractor's suggestions to obtain the best possible pricing. A contractor who is going to be doing other work in the Park has been contacted. The LRPC is projecting a target completion date of May 1, 2020 or sooner.
- Brick Program Hank Diepenbroek reported he has found a new brick supplier has higher quality products (than the previous brick supplier) and their bricks match the existing brick dimensions exactly. Lora will send Hank the old brick form so he can update it with current info.

Looking for something to do this winter?


How about joining us for some indoor flying?


