January 2, 2018 Jefco Aeromod'lers R/C Club Business Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by President Peter Thompson at 7:10 PM at the Alice Terry Elementary School. There were 32 in attendance.

President's Comments: President Thompson introduced new Board Member-At-Large Josh Walsh.

He went on to describe I. C. Carb Day activities. There were five hearty pilots braving the cold temperatures. It was about -5° just before 7:00 A. M. He also announced that we are still looking for volunteers for the auction.

Chatfield Park has a new prairie dog mitigation device that they are sharing with Cherry Creek State Park.

President Thompson encouraged members to be informers, not enforcers when they observe rule violations at the Aerodrome. Many times merely pointing out what the rules are will tame the situation, and that can be done in a very non-confrontational manner.

Program: Kalvin Winder presented his program on designing and building a Boeing 777 model from scratch. He started with a scaled three view drawing of the jetliner. He put them into his copy of Google Sketch-up which allowed him to take the 2-D drawings into 3-D plans and then convert them into ribs, formers and various parts. He custom designed and built the landing gear which looked very realistic during his videos of take-offs and landings. He brought the model itself in and showed many of the 3-D printed parts he incorporated into the project.

He had videos chronicling the design and built process of his Pilatus PC-6 Porter. The build process was the same as that of the 777, but he did not have pictures of the 777 build process so showed the Pilatus instead. His video also showed flights of the 777. He greased his landings very impressively. Kalvin's presentation of this remarkable project was enthusiastically received by those present.

NEW GUESTS and NEW MEMBERS: Robert Sikiyan brought his daughters Emily and Ashley. Patrick O'Grady, who retired last year, and Brian Michael introduced themselves. All are Bud Glass' students. Keven Winder brought his son Kalvin who presented tonight's program.

Secretary's Report: Bruce Ream made a motion to accept the December 5, 2018 general meeting minutes as published in the January, 2019 newsletter. The motion was seconded by Tony Christensen and carried.

Treasurer's Report: Lora Knowlton presented the 2019 proposed budget. Lora had a comprehensive 3 page line item budget. Lora thoroughly presented the source of the numbers she used to build the budget. After some discussion, Tony Christensen motioned to accept the proposed budget as presented. The motion was seconded by Bud Glass and the motion passed

Lora pointed out she presented the Club's account balances as of Dec. 31, 2018 as part of the proposed 3

budget presentation, and there has been no activity since then. Larry Fagan motioned to accept the treasurer's report, Ron Ratcliffe seconded and the motion passed.

Committee Reports:

- **Membership Report:** Lora Knowlton stated she has sent out invoices for membership renewals, and everyone who was a member in 2018 should have received them by now. Lora reported that 130 members have already renewed for 2019.
- Field Maintenance and Runways: Bud Glass, no report.
- **FPV:** Bud Glass pointed out that the Park has approved FPV racing at the Park, but that the Club has not, so it is not in effect yet. He went on to recount several things that the existing FPV committee needs to accomplish, such as signage and prerequisite items they need to get set up. He still is optimistic about being ready for the Club to host an FPV event sometime in the spring. Bud will now look at setting up a fixed wing FPV rules committee. He would welcome anyone who wishes to volunteer for this committee.
- Flight Instruction / Training: Bud Glass reported he has no new trainees, but he did want to recognize Emily for how far she has come. She is turning into a great pilot. Bud also pointed out that her sister Ashley is following right along and has flown a few times. Lora Knowlton reported that the club received a donation from John Wolf in honor of Bud Glass and all that he does for the Club. Kudos to Bud!
- **Safety:** Ron Ratcliffe reports that the Club is in the process of reprinting copies of the Operations and Safety Manual. He pointed out that pilots are not to fly down the center of the runway for low passes, but are to be 25 feet off the far side of the runway. This keeps the runway clear in the event anyone is faced with making an immediate or unplanned landing. Ron also pointed out that there are no part-time safety rules.
- Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC): Bruce Ream reported that the LRPC received an escrow agreement from Shea Homes. Bruce had a neighbor who is a lawyer look it over and he suggested a couple of minor changes. Bruce sent the modified escrow agreement back to Shea Homes for their approval. He anticipates we will have a signed escrow agreement by next month (February).
- **Auction:** President Thompson announced there would be an auction site visit at the Arapahoe County Fairgrounds January 3. He says he has 21 volunteers signed up and can use more. Setup will be January 25 and the auction on January 26. He pointed out that we will start off with a silent auction until 10:00 with the

President's Comments:

• **Inform not Enforce** - President Thompson stated that he has been talking to presidents of other clubs concerning rules enforcement. His takeaway from these discussions is that we should inform, not enforce. The consensus was that most people will comply with the rules, and when they depart from them it is usually because they do not know what the rules are. In most cases merely informing a person of the rule that they have violated and why it exists is enough to bring about compliance. This approach also defuses any confrontational response that might otherwise occur before it even starts.

Old/Unfinished Business:

• **Safety Manual** - Bud passed out copies of the Field Safety and Operations Manual 2019. While the date on the front cover says 2019, it is not an updated manual. The Board will now start addressing updating the content, especially in view of the impact FPV racing and the new runway alignment will have on field operations.

New Business:

- Auction Update Art Wilson reported that we have 49 people and 72 items preregistered this year. The numbers last year were 135 and 121 respectively. President Thompson presented the volunteer list and went over the various jobs assignments. Bud Glass noted that Craig Farthing is donating a fully built Scat Cat pylon racer for a drawing at the auction. It will only need a battery and receiver to be ready to fly. Bud suggested that tickets be \$1.00 each. He also asked how we are advertising the auction and if there are any Hobby Shop sponsors. This led to a lengthy discussion about handling estate sales.
- **Club History and Marketing.** Terry Barnhart, a club member, had submitted some suggestions to President Thompson. One of the things Terry brought up was having a process for keeping Club historical documents. It was suggested that this might be an appropriate subject for presentation at a future club meeting.

Terry also had some suggestions about marketing the Club and its activities. Terry's suggestions sparked an enthusiastic conversation about the possibilities this could mean for the Club. President Thompson will meet with Terry in the near future.

• LRPC Meeting: February - President Thompson will get with Bruce Ream about presenting an update after 4

the auction.

Secretaries Report: Larry Fagan pointed out that there were errors in the November and December BOD minutes published in the January newsletter.

Ron Ratcliffe was listed present as Safety Officer, a position he did not hold until January 1, 2019. I just wanted to touch on lipo safety this month.

Many of us are using 4 & 6s batteries these days which can be a bigger fire than 2 or 3s batteries. Not that any and all aren't potential road flares.

I plan to show a video at our next meeting showing tests on different charge/storage methods with lipo fires. The long and the short of it is an ammo can with the gasket removed seemed to work the best.

Needless to say if it's on a combustible surface and around combustibles all bets are off.

Keep an extinguisher handy and realize you may have to dump the whole thing and perhaps not put it out.

Lipos don't like heat or cold so storing them in the garage or shed out back is not an option.

Just a word to the wise and take safety seriously.
