President's Message - May, 2019

Meeting was called to order at 6:13 PM by President Peter Thompson.

President's Comments:

 What's Up? - President Thompson received a call from another club president, asking how the Jefco Aeromod'lers handles minors being dropped off at the flying field (i.e. no parent supervision). The Board discussed and while our club has not experienced any similar issues, it was decided that this is a case-by-case situation and will be addressed as needed.

Old/Unfinished Business:

- **Bylaws Update** The proposed bylaws update defining the duties and responsibilities of the Board of Directors was presented at the March business meeting and was published in the April newsletter. A vote on the proposal will be held at the May meeting. Online voting is encouraged and will be available for those who are unable to attend that meeting. Information about the proposal and voting procedures will be sent out in an email blast. The voting options will also be published in the May newsletter.
- **Safety Manual** The update of the Field Safety & Operations Manual will be postponed until all FPV fixed wing and FPV drone racing rules can be incorporated into the updated manual and the required field signage at the Aerodrome is approved by the Park.
- Task Force Fundraising & Revenue Generation
 Ideas Hank Diepenbroek said that rather forming a task force, he encouraged all members to offer their ideas and funnel them to the Board for review.

New Business:

- Open Board Position Due to Art Wilson moving out of town and his board resignation, there is now an open board position. The Board discussed recruiting a club member who has a passion for the club and the hobby. Board members will seek such a member for this position. Glenn Lee said we should be in no rush to fill the position.
- Member Appreciation The Board discussed the need to show more appreciation to our members for their contributions to the club. Membership chair Lora Knowlton noted we have about 200 members, but only about 25 show up to meetings. Lora suggested the need to revisit member benefits and how to attract more of the 200 members to club meetings and activities. She suggested considering quarterly breakfast meetings and/ or brown bag lunch gatherings (for those who can't attend evening meetings), new/improved activities, meeting programs to include field trips to aviation-related facilities, etc, and ways to improve communications. Bud

Glass brought up several suggestions for upgrading the newsletter, including overhauling the format, designating specific items to covered with each issue, possibly eliminating the birthday block to create more space for meaningful content, and having a peer review of the issue before publication. Bud also suggested establishing a formal procedure for setting up new committees. When the Board determines the need for a committee, the president writes up a brief description of the purpose of the committee and the intended outcome, assigns a member to chair that committee, and states what factors determine the end of the need for the committee. To insure this is openly and properly communicated to the membership, Bud recommended this be published in the newsletter.

• Fun Fly - President Thompson presented a proposal by club member Jeff Gittelman for having more fun flys this flying season. He advanced several ideas for events. This would be similar to our "Old Farts Fun-Flys" but would hopefully attract more participants. The Board was very pleased to see his proposal. Jeff also suggested publishing a voluntary member list with limited access. Membership Chair Lora noted that the club does not publish the membership list due to past complaints regarding some members inappropriate use of the membership roster.

Secretary's Report: Larry Fagan requested motion for approval of March 20, 2019 meeting minutes as published in the April newsletter. Ron Radcliffe made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Bud Glass and the motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Lora Knowlton distributed financials through April 17. Lora stated the financials did not include the \$549.00 that we produced from the Mini-Auction. She also noted that with the spring flying season quickly approaching, new club memberships traditionally will pick up. A motion was made by Larry Fagan to accept the Treasurer's report which was seconded by Hank Diepenbroek. The motion carried.

Safety: Ron Ratcliffe reported finding a damaged Lipo battery in the barbecue grill again. It was still showing about 20 Volts charge left. Bud has salvaged one of the Park's soda can trash barrels to be repurposed for use as a lipo battery disposal container and he and Ron will be putting it out for use soon.

Committee Reports:

• **Membership Report:** Lora Knowlton reported that there are 194 club members which includes Life, Junior,

Associate and Regular members. She also reported that AMA Gold Leader Club status was renewed.

- Field Maintenance & Runways: Bud Glass reported that 3 of the old startup benches are left. He will modify one to use as a work table for equipment maintenance in the storage yard. He will move another with uprights over to the field next to the dumpster for sustained running of gas and glow engines (which is prohibited in the pit area), and he will add a small plastic covered sign to each startup stand as a reminder. Bud discussed bringing electrical power into the Club's maintenance shed from the new camper registration area. Talks are preliminary at this time. Bud said he is waiting on information he requested from the park.




March 2019 program, Cutting and Sheeting Foam Wings - Presented by Craig Farthing

Craig Farthing presented an excellent program about cutting and sheeting foam wing cores. Left, Craig narrates a video he made of laying up a wing for a high performance pylon racer. The video showed how to lay up extra reinforcement using fiberglass cloth and carbon fiber. The video also covered installing and reinforcing wing hold down bolt hard points. Craig used epoxy for the adhesive in this high performance wing. Carbon fiber tows were used to form the spars right on the sheeting. The wing hold down bolt hard points used carbon fiber mat and epoxy infused with micro balloons. The video ended with Craig vacuum bagging the completed wing and leaving it to cure for about 5 hours.

Craig brought his foam cutter and bagging equipment to demonstrate cutting and sheeting a Scat Cat wing. Due to its milder performance he only needed to use a spray adhesive.


