President's Message - June, 2020



The new diagonal runway is finally a reality! This is due to the forward vision, hard work and many long hours put into this project for the past five plus years by the members of the Long-Range Planning Committee (LRPC). Thank you, Bruce Ream, Bill Zimmerman, Chuck Beckey, John Park, Larry Bickel and Tom Elliot. The club greatly appreciates all of your efforts and dedication to the club. Great job!

May 13, Bruce Ream and John Park announced their resignation from the LRPC. I have assumed the position of Chair of the LRPC and Project Manager through the completion and close out of this project. Thanks again to both of you for your contributions to the club and the LRPC.

The new runway is beautiful, and once the new grass takes seed and sprouts up, it will look even better. While the asphalt runway work is complete, we are working through a number of punch list items with the contractor. There are a few minor details that we know still need a bit more attention, and we are working on a plan to complete those now, so please be patient with your criticisms while we work through these issues.

We are planning to fill the cracks and seal the old runways, add striping to both runways and add lettering to clearly identify taxiways and heli pads. (If we receive enough in donations to pay for it). The Board of Directors will be looking into the feasibility of some other future amenities like additional seating and assembly tables. I have spoken with the park to see if they might be willing to provide a couple more picnic tables and possibly some of the shaded benches like they have at Cherry Creek. They are looking into that request. We are open to any and all suggestions from club members as well. A dozen members responded to the "yea" or "nay" link in last month's newsletter regarding striping the runways. Comments from all but one of those who responded were favorable. A few offered up donations. Since striping was cut from the 2020 budget to help balance the budget, we still need more money to get the striping done. Member Rowell Heigh, has over 45 years' experience in construction and road-building. Rowell volunteered many hours of his time to assist the club by lending his expertise in the area of quality control as it pertains to preparation, placement and finishing of asphalt paving. He was a big help. Thank You Rowell!

I would like to wish member Derrick Nedzel well, as he is recovering from neurosurgery that he underwent last fall. Derrick reports that his recovery is going well and he is hopeful that he will be able to return to driving and flying later this summer. Good Luck Derrick!

JEFCO AEROMOD'LERS RC CLUB Board of Directors VIRTUAL Meeting Notes Wednesday, May 20, 2020

VIRTUAL MEETING NOTICE: President Bud Glass canceled the usual monthly Board of Directors meeting due to Safer-At-Home COVID-19 orders. Board members exchanged reports via email and those reports have been compiled into this document.

NEW BUSINESS:

Long Range Planning Committee – May 13, LRPC Chair Bruce Ream announced his resignation from the committee and stepped down from his role as Project Manager of the new runway project. May 14, John Park announced that he was also resigning from the LRPC. Bud immediately stepped into the role of Chair of the LRPC and Project Manager to see the project through to completion. Larry Bickel, Tom Elliot, Bill Zimmerman, and Chuck Beckey remain on the LRPC and have been very helpful in the efforts to get this project completed and closed out. There are on-going negotiations with the paving contractor regarding some quality control issues and a few punch list items yet to be completed.

<u>Aerodrome Reopening</u> –The Aerodrome flying field, including the new runway, reopened on May 15. All campgrounds, park offices, picnic areas and picnic tables had been closed throughout the park since April 1. The pavilion and all picnic tables are still closed due to COVID-19 social distancing orders still in place. The social distancing orders are also still in place for the rest of the Aerodrome. Bud noted pilots should watch their step around the runways as there are still some rough areas which will be fixed in the near future. Please follow all existing safety rules and communicate with your fellow pilots, and STAY OFF THE NEWLY SEEDED AREAS.

<u>Runway Crack-Fill and Resealing</u> – Bud stated he also wants to do some crack-fill and resealing on the remaining old portion of the existing E/W runway which is in need of repair. With striping appearing to be eminent, it would be best to get all this work done first. He does not have a quote as yet for this work. He suggested that Treasurer Lora could transfer funds from the Runway Fund to cover these costs. Lora was in agreement that this is an appropriate use of the runway fund money. The Board unanimously approved the expenditure.

<u>Runway Striping</u> – Bud suggested that the runways should be striped and could be paid for through donations. Striping had been cut from the budget for this year to help balance the budget. The Board unanimously approved accepting donations to fund this project. Bud noted he has already received commitments for \$750 for this project before even starting a formal fund-raising project. <u>Club Photographer</u> – Bud Glass announced that Rick Gonzales volunteered to assume the position of club photographer. Rick will be relieving Bud of this responsibility. Rick has already contributed several great photos to the newsletter.

SECRETARY/TREASURER'S REPORT:

Secretary's Report -

- April 15 Board of Directors Meeting cancelled due to COVID-19 but held as a virtual meeting. Board members submitted emailed reports. The meeting notes were compiled and emailed to the board and published in the May newsletter.
- May 6 Club Meeting cancelled due to COVID-19. No report.
- May 20 Board of Directors Virtual Meeting reports will be compiled and published in the June newsletter.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Treasurer Lora Knowlton presented the financials to date via May 9, 2020 email to the Board.

- Balance Sheet (as of May 9) reflects all transactions to date.
- Profit & Loss Statement (as of May 9)
 Income
 - membership renewals have picked up with several new memberships and some renewals
 - history book order payments are nearly complete; there are 10 people who still owe
 - since the Warbirds event will be 'scaling back', there has been no registration income. This would typically be a revenue source this time of each year.
 - Received a \$60 donation from club member Tom Higgins; he donated a portion of sales of his custom wooden field stands.

designation releases the requirement to have a CD on site and there is no official registration or reporting back to AMA. All field rules and regs would apply. By down scaling there will be no official registration, no fees, no catering, no merchandise, i.e. no expense to the club. Warbirds & Classic flying will still take place - as a way to honor and celebrate those aircraft and those who flew them. If on approximately June 1, there are statewide orders that limit attendance at outdoor events - then the event would likely be cancelled or put those attendance limits in place. Either way, that would be determined approximately June 1. President Glass accepted Lora's recommendation as a motion which was seconded by Craig Farthing. The motion was unanimously approved. Lora subsequently submitted a note to the newsletter editor to publish in the June newsletter about the changes to the Warbirds & Classics Over Denver event.

<u>July Business Meeting & BBQ</u> – is still scheduled for Wednesday, July 1 at the flying field at this time. Smiley will again provide his fantastic BBQ menu. Details to be confirmed and promoted soon.

Safety Spotlight

Near miss, or was it? Date: May 23, 2020

Location: Chatfield Aerodrome

A pilot, who was not flying, walked out onto the active runway to look for a lost article. He was struck in the wrist by a pilot who was landing his Foamie.

I investigated the incident and here is what I learned:

There were Three pilots on the active runway flying. The pilot who was looking for the lost article notified the pilots flying (from a distance) that he was going out onto the active runway. At the same time one of the pilots asked permission of the active pilots for clearance to land. The landing pilot was cleared to land from the remaining two active pilots.

From the distance the pilot, looking for the lost article, thought he was given permission to walk onto the runway where he was struck in the wrist by the landing pilot.

The good news is the injury was not life threatening and all seems good at the writing of this article.

Could this incident been prevented: YES

- 1) The person walking onto the active runway should have clearly stated his intentions by communicating directly with the flight line and not from a distance.
- 2) Active pilots should be aware of the surrounding.
- 3) The use of a spotter could have prevented this incident.

Warbirds and Classics Over Denver Update June 12 – 14, 2020



The New Runway – from Starting Sketch to Final Drawing


I asked Bruce Ream for a copy of the original sketch. His response follows:

Hi Larry, It wasn't a napkin. I took a print from Google Earth to the meeting with Shea and this showed our field. I sketched right on the print with a pen the diagonal runway and the flying pattern while we were in the meeting. I also figured out the scale so we could show them how long the runway would be. There are also some dashed lines outlining where the flying boundaries might be.
